

Our vacancy

The Community Neuro and Stroke Service Planned Neuro Team provides rehabilitation and therapy support in the community for adults with complex long term neurological conditions. The team consists of Speech and Language Therapists, Physiotherapists, Occupational Therapists, Specialist Nurses, Rehabilitation Assistants and a Clinical Neuropsychologist. We work closely with other health and social care colleagues and voluntary organisations to provide person centred care.

The Planned Neuro Team provides a 5-day service between the hours of 08.00 – 17.00 and provides planned therapy interventions in service users' homes, place of residence or within the local community across Bath and North East Somerset. It is based at St. Martin's Hospital in Bath.

We are seeking a part time (18.75 hours a week) band 6 Occupational Therapist. The successful candidate will undertake specialist person-centred assessment, rehabilitation and management for people with long term neurological conditions including the promotion of health and prevention of secondary complications. They will visit service users at home or in the community and work in collaboration with the team, family members, carers and other appropriate services to achieve person centred goals and promote independence and wellbeing.

The successful candidate will be responsible for their own workload and receive supervision and support from the Clinical Specialist Occupational Therapist, Team Lead and other specialist clinicians.

Your personal and professional development will be supported and encouraged in this role.

You must have the relevant professional qualification and be registered with HCPC.

This role is community based and therefore you must have a valid UK driving license and your own transport to enable you to travel to appointments across BANES.

It is essential that you have experience of providing rehabilitation within a multidisciplinary team and have experience of working in a community setting and with neurological conditions. You must have evidence of relevant post graduate learning and development and demonstrate that your clinical practice is person centred and evidence based. The ability to work as part of a team, show initiative and be flexible in your work is essential. You must have good communication skills and be able to relate to people in sometimes challenging and complex situations.
