Job purpose

We are looking for someone to join our team on a bank contract who is trained on the delivery of non-scalpel vasectomies

The Integrated Sexual Health Service offers clinics in Chester, as well as community clinics in Ellesmere Port, Winsford, Northwich, Neston, and Blacon. The current vasectomy clinic is located at our Chester hub, Fountains Clinic, Delamere Street, Chester, CH1 4DS.

We are looking to offer the opportunity to individuals who are able to work with us where required. *Please note that in this service the sessions are for 4 hours.*

Key responsibilities

You will be responsible for the delivery of non-scalpel vasectomies, working within the Integrated Sexual Health Service. The wider service incorporates several key elements, including contraception services, genitourinary medicine, vasectomy, HIV treatment, cervical cytology and sub-contracted services delivered by GPs, pharmacies and the voluntary sector within Chester.

You will work in close collaboration with the other members of the clinical team to deliver outstanding patient-centred care that meets the needs of the local population and reduces health inequalities.

Your main duties and responsibilities will be to provide high quality, safe and effective clinical services for patients undergoing vasectomy and associated care. There is a Service Operating Procedure that is in place for the procedure to ensure that there is adherence to clinical and safety standards.

Other duties:

- To perform non-scalpel vasectomies under local anaesthesia and assist with the organisation of surgical lists.
- Undertakes a “on the day” reiteration of the preoperative assessment ensuring that all patients are suitable to proceed for the intervention and on the day observations. Ensuring patients are fully informed, consent obtained, and any identified risks reiterated.
- To provide support and information to clients during the procedure and immediately post-operatively and review post operative semen analysis result
